High School Completion Status and the Federal Pell Grant

To receive Federal Pell Grant funds for enrollment at BATC a student must be qualified at the postsecondary level. Qualifying students must have a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent. This can be from a foreign school so long as it is equivalent to a US high school diploma.

The <u>General Education Development</u> (GED) certificate is a recognized equivalent to a high school diploma. A certificate of completion of a <u>home-study program</u> is also considered an equivalent of a high school diploma if the program is recognized by the student's home state. In the state of Utah completion of a home-schooled program is not a recognized equivalent. A <u>Certificate of Completion</u> is not considered a valid high school diploma or recognized equivalent. A certificate that the student has passed a <u>state authorized examination</u> is acceptable as long as the issuing state recognizes it as equivalent to a high school diploma.

Students who submit the FAFSA are asked to report their high school completion status. You may have not answered the questions regarding your high school completion status or you have indicated that you have not received a high school diploma or GED certificate.
