SHORT-TERM CLASSES

CONTINUING EDUCATION, SKILL UPGRADE, LIFE-LONG LEARNING

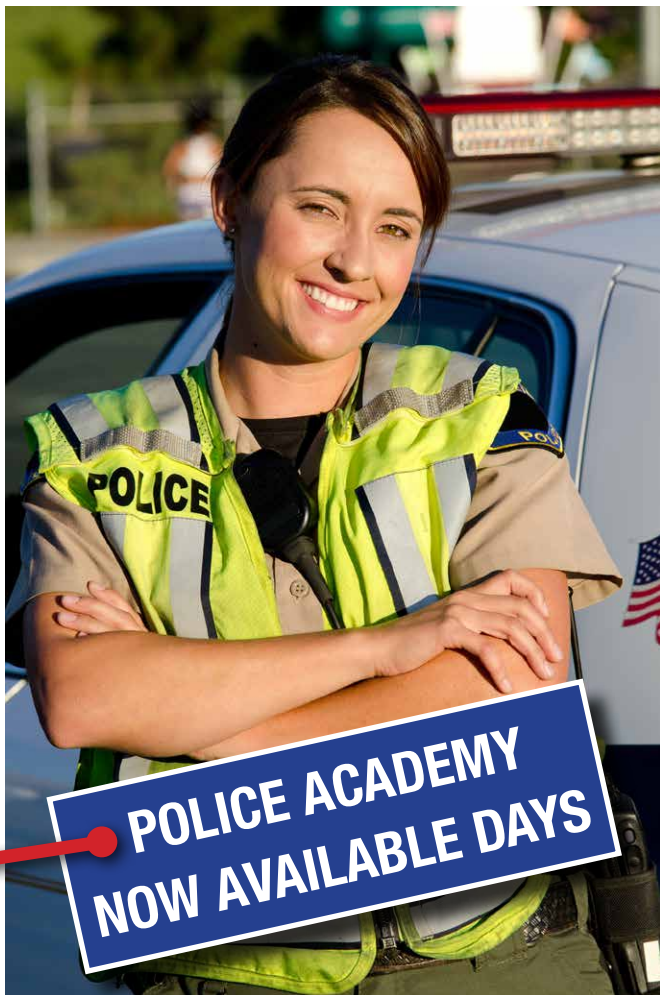

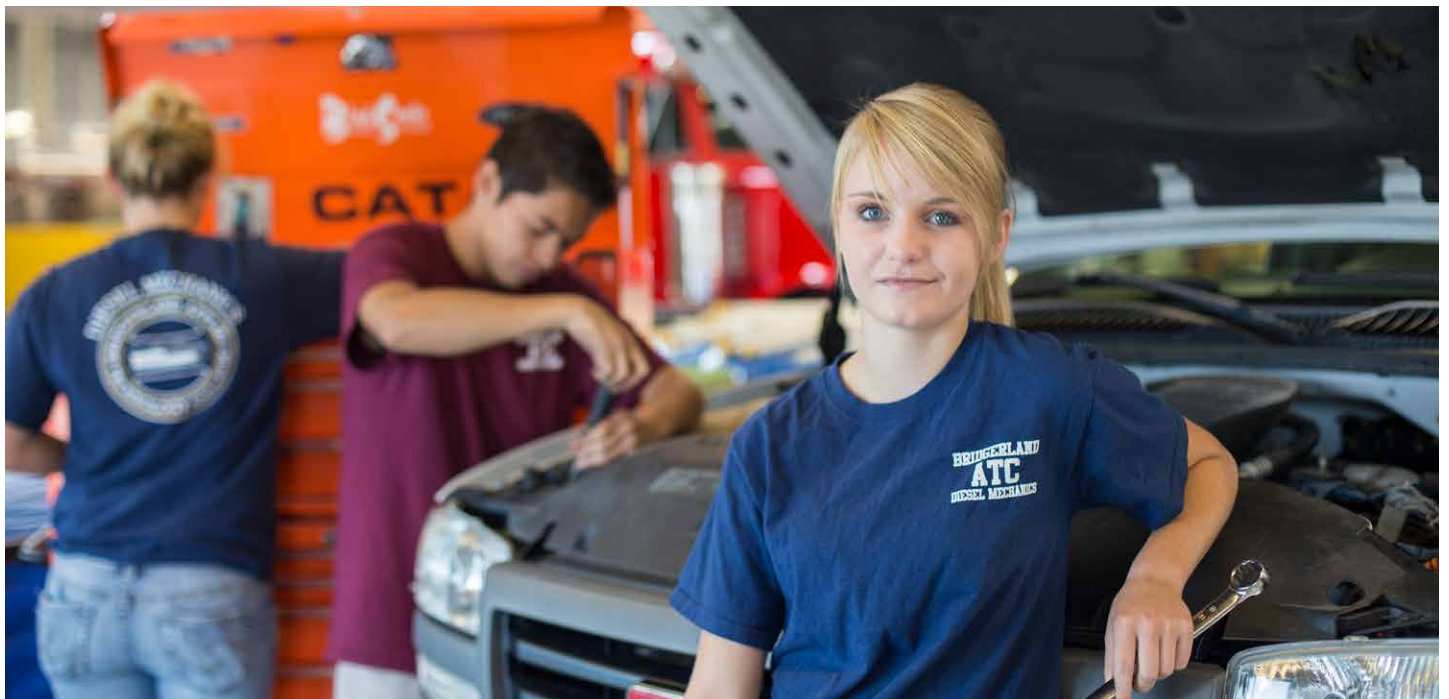
