STUDENT ELIGIBILITY AND ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

General Eligibility: Students may be eligible to receive Federal Student Aid (FSA or Pell Grant) at Bridgerland Applied Technology College (BATC) if they meet the following criteria which include:

- → Students must be a citizen of the United States or be an eligible non-citizen with documentation.
- → Students must be enrolled as a regular student in an eligible* program. A regular student is defined as a person who enrolls for the purpose of obtaining a (degree or) certificate offered by the institution. *See BATC's Pell Grant Eligible Programs list.
- → Students must be making Satisfactory Progress as determined by BATC.
- → Students must not be in default on any FSA loan or owe an overpayment on any FSA grant. Or- students must have made satisfactory arrangements to repay a defaulted loan or grant overpayment.
- → Male students between the ages of 18 and 26 are required to register with the Selective Service and must certify that this has been done.
- → Students must not have received a Bachelor's Degree.
- → Students must fall within a Pell Lifetime Eligibility Unit (LEU) of 12 semesters or 600% of all scheduled Pell Grant awards received. Once a student reaches 600%, the student is no longer eligible to receive the Pell Grant. This requirement is effective with the 2012-13 Pell award and replaces the 900% lifetime limit equivalent for first time Pell recipients that came into effect July 2008. Consecutive and concurrent program enrollment may limit student eligibility to receive financial aid at BATC visit the Financial Aid Office for more information.
- → Students will not receive a Federal Pell Grant from more than one school for the same period of time.

Academic Qualifications: Students submitting application for financial aid will be asked their graduation status on the application. To receive FSA:

→ Students must have a high school diploma, or its recognized equivalent,

FSA regulation has identified the General Education Development (GED) certificate as a recognized equivalent to a high school diploma. A certificate of completion of a home-study

program is also considered an equivalent of a high school diploma if the program is recognized by the students' home state. In the state of Utah, completion of a home study program is not a recognized equivalent. A *Certificate of Completion* is not considered a valid high school diploma or recognized equivalent. Ability to Benefit testing is no longer an approved measure for financial aid purposes (effective July 1, 2012).

Students who have received a high school diploma or GED may simply indicate so on their application(s) for financial aid.

Students without a high school diploma or GED must complete one of the following options in order to be eligible for FSA.

After a student has successfully completed one of these requirements - and has provided proof to the Financial Aid office that this has been done - financial aid will be processed as usual. Eligibility may be effective from the received date of the high school diploma or GED.
