

SHORT-TERM CLASSES

CONTINUING EDUCATION, SKILL UPGRADE, LIFE-LONG LEARNING

Short-Term courses vary in length from 10 hours to 250 hours and are offered primarily in the evening. These courses are designed to improve employment skills and/or stimulate interest in rewarding occupational programs.

Refund Policy:

100% will be refunded up to five working days after the first scheduled class, and none thereafter. For courses with lengths less than five days, 100% will be refunded prior to the beginning of class and none thereafter.
