#### **FEDERAL & STATE GRANTS**

#### **▶** Federal Pell Grant:

- ✓ Tuition/Fees
- ✓ Books/Tools/Supplies
- ✓ Room/Board
- ✓ Personal Expenses

The Federal Pell Grant program provides grants to eligible students enrolled in eligible certificate programs, who demonstrate financial need and meet other general requirements for Federal Student Aid. Disbursed in installments throughout the year, students may use the Pell Grant to pay for costs associated with education beyond high school. Apply for this grant annually. Pell Grant (FAFSA) applications are available on-line at <a href="fafsa.ed.gov">fafsa.ed.gov</a> Students will be contacted by the BATC Financial Aid Office within two weeks after application is successfully submitted.

# ▶ Zero EFC Treatment or Iraq & Afghanistan Service Grant

✓ Increased Pell Grant award (see above)

An otherwise Federal Pell Grant eligible student whose parent (or guardian) died as a result of US military service in Iraq or Afghanistan after September 11, 2001 may receive increased amounts of federal aid if the student was less than 24 years old when the parent or guardian died, or enrolled at an institution of higher education at the time of the death. The Department of Education will notify BATC when a student appears to meet the criteria and inform the student of his or her possible increase in eligibility as well.

# Success Stipend Program (SSP)

✓ School related expenses

The Success Stipend Program is a state funded need-based financial aid program for Utah residents currently enrolled in an eligible BATC preparatory program. SSP recipients must be enrolled a minimum of 15 hours per week. These one-time stipends are offered to students with the greatest financial need as determined by the FAFSA (see Federal Pell Grant above). Eligible students will be notified.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

Scholarships are generally applied in full directly to the students account within two weeks of the student accepting the award.

## ▶ BATC Scholarship (for adult students)

✓ Tuition

The BATC Scholarship (for adult students) is a waiver of tuition up to \$1,000. The waiver is awarded to adult students currently enrolled in a BATC certificate program or who have completed admissions and have a confirmed start date. Recipients will be selected on the basis of both merit and need. Applications, available at the BATC Financial Aid Office and on-line at <a href="www.batc.edu">www.batc.edu</a>, are evaluated once each quarter (Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall) and multiple recipients may be selected.

## Rotary Scholarship:

- ✓ Tuition
- ✓ Required Bookstore expenses

This scholarship is offered by the Logan Rotary Club and is awarded to adult students attending the BATC Logan Campus. Applications are processed yearly and are available to current students. Areas of consideration may include employment history, educational and career plans, financial situation, community service, extracurricular activities, letter of recommendation, and interview. The organization may award additional funding for limited tuition or bookstore purchases as well. Recipients are recognized at the Women in Business Scholarship Luncheon. Application may open during the

# **▶ BATC Scholarship** (for graduating high school seniors):

✓ Tuition

The BATC Scholarship (for graduating high school seniors), a tuition waiver up to \$1,000, is awarded to high school seniors who will graduate from one of the high schools located in the Cache, Logan, Box Elder, Bear River, and Rich districts, who have a desire to succeed in a technical area and who are serious about attending and completing their training at BATC. Selection determined by BATC's Scholarship Committee following application and interview. Scholarship applications must be received by the Financial Aid Office no later than February 28, of the current school year. ### ▶ Career & Technical Education (CTE) Tuition Award:

✓ Tuition

The CTE Award, a tuition waiver up to \$1,000, is a state selected scholarship awarded to Utah high school seniors who will graduate and are earnest about enrolling in an applied technology program at BATC or other participating postsecondary institutions. Applications must be submitted by the postmark deadline to the state selection committee who will evaluate and rank all applications. Areas of consideration include academic transcripts, education & occupational experience and plans, and letters of recommendation. ## **▶** BATC Summer Free Start Scholarship

✓ Tuition

The BATC Summer Free Start Scholarship waives tuition up to \$500 in a BATC certificate program for selected recipients who begin training during June, July, August, or September immediately following graduation from high school in the Cache, Logan, Box Elder, Bear River, or Rich school districts. Eligible students are those who were enrolled at BATC as a high school student or others who plan to attend BATC for the first time. Utah DRS assists eligible individuals with disabilities in obtaining employment. An eligible individual is one who is physically or psychologically disabled who demonstrates impediments to obtaining, retaining, or reentering employment and must acquire rehabilitation services in order to have an employment outcome. Along with the completed application, additional evaluations or assessments may be required.
